Black College Championships, L.L.C. was formed in 2021 to organize and run Historically Black College and University baseball World Series events. About The Montgomery Biscuits

The Montgomery Biscuits are a Minor League Baseball team based in Montgomery, Alabama. They are the Double-A affiliate of the Tampa Bay Rays and play in the Double-A South. The team was founded in Orlando, Florida, in 1973 as the Orlando Twins, an affiliate of the Minnesota Twins in the Southern League. After remaining in the Minnesota minor league organization for 20 seasons, the team became an affiliate of the Chicago Cubs for four seasons and then the Seattle Mariners for one. In 1999, the team became an affiliate of the Tampa Bay Rays, and they have remained in the organization ever since. They became members of the Double-A South in 2021. Montgomery Riverwalk Stadium is the home of the Biscuits. The minor league baseball ballpark opened in 2004. Located in downtown Montgomery, the stadium can host up to 7,000 people a night. The Stadium offers a riverfront area that is easily accessible from Riverwalk Stadium, 20 luxury suites, picnic areas along the third-base line and in the left-center field. The picnic area in the left-center field can accommodate up to 4,000 fans. The stadium also has a full bar, called "The Club Car Bar" and a children's playground area located down the third base line. Rules - The 2023 and 2024 Baseball Rules and Interpretations shall be used for championship play.

Each team is responsible for full understanding of the current 2023 and 2024 Baseball Rules Book.

Admission and Tickets

All persons entering the stadium must have a valid game ticket or tournament-issued credential. No exceptions will be made. Ticket prices are as follows:

Gates will open one half hour prior to the designated start time for each game. The ticket window at Biscuits Stadium will open at 8:30 a.m. on tournament game days. The ticket office at the corner of 200 Coosa Street will be open at 8:30 a.m. during the tournament May 8-11, 2024, and will be selling only admission tickets.

Each participating team's fans will be required to purchase their own tickets for their games and all others. Absolutely no complimentary tickets will be issued for this event.

All-Tournament Tickets will be available for purchase throughout the event. Single session tickets will not be available for purchase until the conclusion of each previous game at the Biscuits Stadium Box Office.

Biscuits Stadium will be cleared between each game, and a separate ticket will be required for admission to each game.

Pass List

Each institution will be provided with an area near the main entrance on the southwest corner of Biscuits Stadium to distribute tickets via a pass list. Participating schools may provide their own ticket staff to administer this pass list. Oklahoma State University will staff this for visiting teams provided Casey Friesen is notified of this need prior to 10:00 a.m. Thursday, June 1, 2023. Tickets for player guests must come out of each school's allotment.

Credentials

Each participating team will receive credentials at the pre-tournament meeting for the number of individuals listed on the Official Team Roster (Appendix B). The team members, auxiliary staff, and bat handlers will receive participant credentials which will provide access to Biscuits Stadium, dugouts (during games in which your team is participating), batting cage area (during your team's designated hitting time), team clubhouse and the field. Administrators traveling with the team will be provided an all-access pass which will provide access to the areas listed above and the press box area upon written request to the Tournament Director.

Participants' Gate

All individuals listed on the 40-person team roster must the enter facility for competition through the gate beyond the left field gate at Biscuits Stadium. All participants entering this gate will be expected to have a credential on their person or attached to their travel bag. Bat-handlers in official uniform will be admitted through the participants' gates only for those games in which their team is playing.

Team drop-off and pick-up for the practice day will take place directly east of the indoor hitting facility beyond the left field gate and home bullpen.

Participants entering the stadium to watch another contest may enter any gate of Biscuits Stadium with the appropriate credential.

Scouting and Pitching Charting Seats

Four seats behind home plate (two seats per non-participating team) are reserved for the scouting purposes of teams not participating in each game. These seats are assigned as followed:

Higher seed- Section 112 Row 8 Seats 1-2 Lower seed- Section 112 Row 5 Seats 12-13

Four additional seats behind home plate (two seats per participating team) are reserved for the teams participating in that game to chart pitches. Occupants of these seats may use video recording devices in this location but should not be transmitting any data or video until the game is completed. These seats are assigned as followed:

Higher seed- Section 112 Row 5 Seats 1-2 Lower seed- Section 112 Row 5 Seats 12-13

It is permissible to film games your team is participating in, but you may not film any other games.

Pre-Tournament Meeting

A pre-tournament meeting will be held on Thursday, June 1, 2023, at 4:30 p.m. in the Club Level at Biscuits Stadium. Head coaches and administrative representatives from each team must attend. The NCAA Game Representative will conduct this meeting. Please bring a copy of your 40-person official team roster and a list of any players ejected or disqualified from competition during the 2023 season.

Practice

Each team will be allotted 75 minutes for practice on the playing field on Thursday, June 1, 2023 (Practice will be moved to the indoor hitting facility if weather prevents use of the playing field). Times have been assigned and included in the Schedule of Events.

Please enter the stadium through the participant gate in left field designated on the map included as Appendix C.

Determination of Home Team

For first-round games, the highest-seeded team shall be designated as the home team. In subsequent games, the home team shall be determined according to a formula applied by the games committee. In determining which of two teams in any game will be the home team, the games committee or the NCAA site representatives uses the following guidelines:

1) The institution that has been the home team the fewer number of times in that particular tournament shall be designated the home team.

2) If the two teams are equal in this respect but unequal in the number of times they were the visitor, then the team that has been the visitor more often will be designated the home team.

3) If the two teams are equal in the number of times that they have been home and visitor, the games committee or the NCAA site representative(s) shall observe the following procedures in the order stated: a) If the two teams have met previously in that particular tournament, the visitor in the previous game shall be the home team in the game in question. b) The team that was the visitor in its preceding game shall be the home team, unless both teams were visitors in their preceding games.

4) If the two teams are different seeds, the better seeded team will be designated as the home team.

5) If the above procedures do not resolve the matter, the home team shall be determined by a coin toss. The coin toss will be held on the field immediately after the game that causes the situation to develop and both coaches are to be in attendance. The higher seeded team can determine whether they will call the coin toss or defer the call to their opponent.

Team Introductions

Introductions are conducted only for the first game in which a team competes in each round. Visiting team is introduced first (support personnel/assistant coaches/nonstarters (numerically)/starters (line-up order)/head coach, go to spot down the foul line next to the base of the designated visiting team dugout for the first person introduced proceeding toward home plate. The home team shall be introduced in the same manner down the foul line next to the base of the designated home team dugout. If applicable, both teams should stay on the field until after the conclusion of the National Anthem.

<u>Uniforms</u>

Teams must enter Biscuits Stadium in full pre-game or regular game uniform. Game uniforms must adhere to Rule 1-14 of the 2023 and 2024 NCAA Baseball Rules and Interpretations. Please note that it is the responsibility of the visiting team to wear a contrasting uniform color to the jersey worn by the home team. The home team will select their desired uniform color first. The BCWS tournament director and umpire-inchief will resolve issues when there is doubt about contrasting colors of uniforms.

Dugouts and Clubhouses

The Home Team will occupy the Third Base Dugout for teams in the NCAA Division II and First Base Dugouts for Teams in the NAIA.

As stated above, ALL teams and team personnel must enter Biscuits Stadium in full pre-game or regular game uniform.

Participants' Valuables

Each team is responsible for its own valuables.

Official Team Roster

Participating teams must complete the NCAA Official Team Roster included in this manual as Appendix D. Each team is limited to four (4) official coaches in uniform, 25 eligible student-athletes in uniform and other personnel (up to a maximum of 5 individuals plus one bat handler). Only uniformed personnel (coaches and student-athletes) are permitted between the white lines and the bullpen. Non-uniformed personnel are permitted in the dugout and should perform official team functions that they performed during the season. Once the game begins the athletic trainer and other medical personnel are permitted on the field only to perform his/her appropriate duty.

A non-rostered bullpen catcher is permitted but must be included in a team's 40-person dugout limit.

Each team is limited to 40 individuals in their dugout during the course of the game. Failure to comply with this regulation could result in forfeiture of the competition.

Drug Testing

If the *Black College World Series* is selected for the NCAA Championship drug testing, a private and secure location has been identified for testing. Student-athletes will not be escorted to the drug testing site until the head coach or other authorized representative for that institution has been notified of that student-athlete's selection.

Electronic Communication Devices

No electronic communication devices (e.g., phones, two-way radios, televisions) are permitted in the bullpens or dugouts during regional competition.

Radar (Speed) Guns

Use of radar (speed) guns by personnel from competing institutions is permissible. The host institution also may display on the scoreboard or video board the speed of each pitch in stadiums where the technology is available.

Laundry Service

No laundry service will be provided to the selected teams for this championship.

Lineup Cards

Each team must present a lineup card to the <u>Official Scorer</u> no later than one hour prior to the start of their game.

Baseballs

The Rawlings MAC 97 Major League Baseball MCB97MLX Professional baseballs will be used for all games during the 2024 Black College World Series Baseball Championship. **Participating teams must provide their own baseballs for practice.**

Bat Handlers

Each team is permitted to have one bat handler in the dugout for each game. Bat Handlers must be 13 years of age or older to serve in this capacity. This individual must be listed on the Official Team Roster (Appendix B) submitted at the pre-tournament meeting Thursday, June 1, 2023. **Bat Handlers shall be required to wear a helmet at all times.**

Bat Testing

NCAA/NAIA Testing procedure as prescribed by the Tournament Director.

Team Mascots

Team mascots will not be permitted on the field at any time.

Institutional Fight Song

No Institutional fight songs shall be played during the Tournament.

Team Meal Deliveries to Biscuits Stadium

Visiting and Home teams arranging for pre-game or post-game team meals to be delivered to Biscuits Stadium should direct deliveries to be taken to the Third Base gate.

Bus Drop-off, Pick-up and Parking

Team drop-off and pick-up for game days will take place directly on Coosa Street near the Third Base entry of Riverwalk stadium. Parking for home and visiting teams buses during games will be provided at Coosa Street. Team buses will be permitted to park along Coosa Street. After each competition, participants may exit the facility through the point of entry- the gate along Third Base entry of the Stadium.

Media Commitments

A fifteen-minute period has been designated following each team's practice to meet with the media. This will be an informal gathering that will take place in the Media Room in Biscuits Stadium. All student-athletes and coaches should be made available to the media during this time.

Following the conclusion of each game the participating teams will be afforded a ten (10) minute coolingoff period which will commence when the Head Coach and all student-athletes have reached the clubhouse/dugout area at the conclusion of the game. At the conclusion of the cooling-off period a member of the tournament media staff will escort the head coach of the losing team and a minimum of two players selected by the Media Coordinator to the Media Room for the post-game press conference. The Media Room is located on the third base/left field side of Biscuits Stadium near the practice infield. The postgame press conference for the head coach of the winning team and a minimum of two players selected by the Media Coordinator will immediately follow the first press conference. Once the ten (10) minute cooling-off period is complete, all locker rooms and dugouts must be opened for media access. All coaches and players must be available to the media.

Regardless of regular-season radio or television commitments, the head coach is obligated to all media covering the Championship and must report to the interview room prior to participating in an interview with any member of the media (i.e., an institution's radio broadcast crew).

<u>Radio</u>

Space will be reserved in the Biscuits Stadium Press Box for each participating institution's designated radio broadcast. Arrangements for credentials and assignment of broadcasting space must be arranged through the Tournament Director, Michael Coker.

Broadcast

All games will be broadcast live stream. If any participating institution wants to bring their own productions broadcast, a \$1000.00 fee non-refundable.

All-Tournament Team

A BCWS All-Tournament Team will be selected by the Tournament chosen committee and will consist of the following positions: catcher, first base, second base, third base, shortstop, left field, center field, right field, designated hitter and one pitcher. The Most Valuable Player (MVP) and Most Valuable Pitcher (MVP) will be selected from this group.

Ground Transportation

The BCWS asks that each selected team provide their own ground transportation.

LIGHTNING AND WEATHER DETECTION


The NCAA usually the Schneider Electric (WeatherSentry) to provide a lightning detection and weather monitoring system. Yet this service will be unavailable at this time for this Championship.

The BCWS has assigned a member of the Tournament staff as the Weather/Safety Coordinator. Dr. Winters will work primarily with the usual Riverwalk Stadium personnel and any team personnel (such as athletic trainers) who are present and made available to him for consultation. This service is provided to ensure the safety of our student-athletes, all spectators, and event management staff.

Montgomery Riverwalk Stadium Ground Rules

<u>All Fields</u>: A fair ball must be hit above the yellow handrail to be considered a home run. A ball bouncing off the handrail netting is in play.

<u>Left Field</u>: A ball that comes to a stop on top of the ribbon board will be considered a ground ruled double.

<u>Center Field</u>: At the spot where the left field wall meets the center field wall, a ball that is hit to the left of the vertical yellow stripe or directly hits the vertical yellow stripe and rebounds into the field of play is considered in play. A ball that hits to the left of the vertical yellow stripe and rebounds over a shorter fence out of play will be considered a ground rule double. A ball that directly hits the vertical yellow stripe and rebounds over the shorter fence or hits to the right of the vertical yellow stripe is a home run.

<u>Right Field</u>: Any fair ball that hits the outfield wall (including 3D sponsored signage) or handrail and bounces over another part of the yellow handrail is a home run. The ball must clear the yellow handrail to be considered a home run. Any ball that becomes lodged in or behind the US Foods sign is a ground rule double.

<u>Dugouts</u>: Unless specified by NCAA Rules Book, the following rules will govern situations at the dugouts:

- A ball rolling onto the top step of the dugouts (which are at ground level) is in play.
- The photographer's area on the outfield sides of each dugout shall be considered part of the dugout.
- A ball rebounding off the dugout screen shall be considered in play.

<u>Screen</u>: There is no break in the screen. A ball striking a guide wire supporting the screen is out of play.

<u>Tarpaulin</u>: A thrown or batted ball that becomes lodged under, behind or in the tarp or cylinder results in two bases. Players may lean on the tarp but may not place both feet on the tarp to make a catch.

On the field, including the practice field, bullpen, bench and dugout, each team is limited to four official coaches in uniform (head coach, assistant coaches and volunteer coach), 27 eligible student-athletes in uniform, and nine additional individuals as determined by the institution. Only uniformed personnel, including coaches and eligible student-athletes, may be permitted between the white lines and in the bullpens.

The bat handler, who must be 13 years of age or older, does not count against the maximum limit of 40 individuals.

Non-uniformed personnel in proper attire may participate in pregame warm-ups. Once a game begins, the athletic trainer or manager is permitted on the field only to perform his/her appropriate duty (e.g., warming up a pitcher is not considered an appropriate duty).

A non-rostered bullpen catcher is permitted but must be included in a team's 40-person dugout limit.

The 40 individuals listed below (+ bat handler) are the only individuals authorized in the dugout.
